New Sign Out / Sign In procedure for parents / students - Reminder from last newsletter

Thank you to those parents who have started using the new sign in / sign out system for our children who are attending appointments during the day or have had to go home unwell.



For those who were not aware, as a way of ensuring that we are fully aware of the movement of all students during the day and to ensure that we are meeting our Health & Safety obligations, we have now set up a new sign out / sign in folder for students leaving during the day. This is kept in the office and sits alongside the Visitors' Book.

We are now asking all parents who are taking children out of school for appointments, to sign their children out at the office. If these children then return to school during the day we would ask that their parent signs them back in. It is hoped that this new procedure will enable us to track accurately where children are, should we have an emergency.

I do appreciate that this new system may take a little bit of time to become the 'norm' but would greatly appreciate the support of all our parents in ensuring that the system is used effectively. Thank you.

Teachers Strike

As you may have heard through the media and through an earlier email I sent in the holidays, the NZEI are planning for a teachers strike to be held on 15th August. At this stage it is a ½ day strike, however we are still waiting for the results of a survey where teachers were asked to vote on the option of a full day strike. As more information comes to hand about the planned strike I will pass it on to you.

A couple of weeks ago I started the newsletter off with a piece about the support you can offer our teachers and education in New Zealand in general. Any strike action that is taken is not done so without a lot of thought and a range of other options considered. As the notice in this section says - it's not just about the pay. It is actually about the conditions, the support for your children and the support for our teachers.

I would encourage you all to take a moment to chat with the teachers about this campaign and to show your support in anyway you can.

Upcoming Road Closure on Milton Avenue, Rangiora (From the WDC)

Work to complete the secondary stopbanks system for the Ashley River/Rakahuri, which involves raising sections of Milton Avenue and Cones Road starts this month. Major roadworks will take place between late July and November 2018 to raise sections of the road to the height of the existing stopbanks on Milton Avenue and Cones Road where the gaps are and will require road closures. This work is the completion of the Ashley River/Rakahuri secondary stopbanks system, a project that provides significant benefit to Rangiora and the wider district, in the form of a more resilient flood protection scheme.

The following road closures will be in place:

Stage 1: Milton Avenue will be closed between River Road and Cones Road from 30th July-15th October.

A detour will be in place via Cones Road.

Stage 2: Cones Road will be closed between Taggart Earthmoving Landscape & Garden Supplies and Milton Avenue from 16th October-23rd November. A detour will be in place via Milton Avenue.

Traffic impacts:

A route from Rangiora to the Ashley bridge will remain open throughout the work period, with detours clearly signposted.

No work will start on Cones Road until the work on Milton Avenue is complete and the road is reopened.

There will be speed restrictions on the detour routes whilst the detours are in place, however the current speed limits will be reinstated on both Milton Avenue and Cones Road once the work is complete.

Access to the dog park, the BMX recreation area, Taggart Earthmoving Landscape & Garden Supplies and the Department of Conservation will still be available throughout the work.

Thank you for your understanding while this work takes place.

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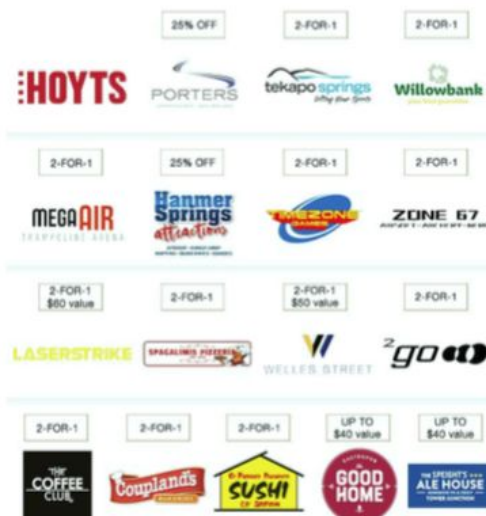

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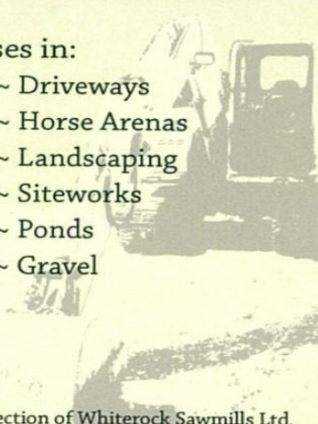
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
