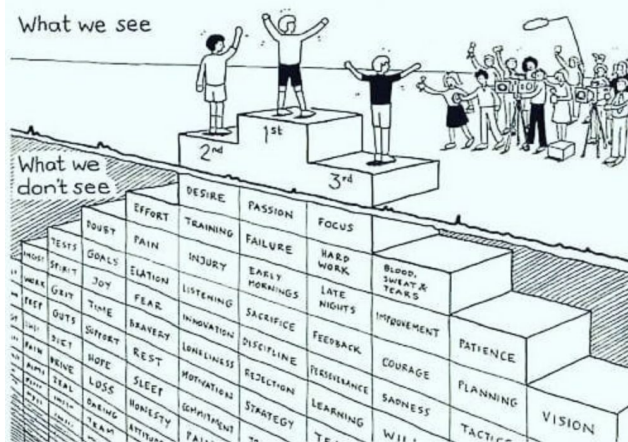

Scholastic Book Fair - Tuesday 30th October to Thursday 1st November

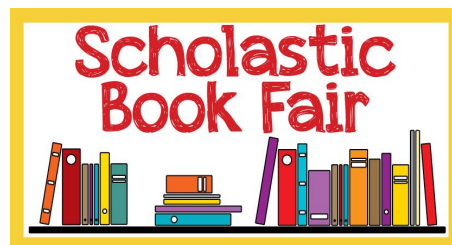
Our annual Scholastic Book Fair is on between the 29th October and 1st November. This is a great opportunity to get some Christmas shopping done so please mark it in your diaries!!

North Loburn School Pet Day

Monday 12th November 2018



The Pet Day google Entry Form was sent out over a week ago and was due last Friday. Thank you to those of you who have already completed this google form. **PLEASE** ensure you complete this form, regardless of whether your child is bringing a pet, by the end of today. We need to know the pets that are being entered so that we can organise judges. Judges need plenty of notice to ensure they can make the day. If you did not receive the google form please email: kate.hassall@northloburn.school.nz. Thank you for your cooperation.

General Information: Please read carefully.

The animals can begin arriving from 12 noon on the day.

Please do not bring animals in the morning as they can become stressed over a long period at school, especially if it is a hot day.

Please make sure they are well caged, if they need to be, and have all the comforts needed e.g. a bird may need a cover to keep out the breeze.

Ponies **must** be kept in their area behind the gate in the back field for safety, until the Grand Parade.

Only owners may go into the field. If the back field is dry, horse floats should be able to come in.

When you arrive please look for the designated area for your pet e.g small pets, poultry, fish and birds will be in the hall, lambs along by the trees to the right in the back field and dogs tied up around the court. Notices will be put up to direct you.

Dogs: It is very important to tie your dog in the correct place if you want it to be judged. Check the lists tied on the netting to see where your dog should go. The judges have lists of dog owners on their sheet. If they can't find you in that area you will not be judged or get a certificate. See Mrs Hassall if there are any problems.

Calves: Sorry NO calves this year please due to Mycoplasma Bovis.

Pet Show Schedule

Monday 12th November

11:00-12:00 - Tabloids sports organised by Totara students.

12:00-1:00 pm. Lunch. Pets to arrive at school. Come along, bring your lunch and share this great day with your children.

1:00-2:00pm - Judging

2:00pm onwards - Lamb drinking race, Look-a-like contest, Grand Parade.

2.30pm Certificates awarded in the hall.

Important:

- **Water containers** for each pet **must be provided at all times.**
- Children may enter one pet only in this year's show, unless they have the same type of pet, e.g. this could be 3 chickens, etc. Families can share a pet but be judged separately.

Events:

1. LAMBS
2. CALVES - please do not bring your calf to pet day, but you can still be judged if you wish.
3. PIGS
4. POULTRY – chickens/roosters/ducks, etc.
5. GOATS
6. DOGS – Please keep dogs tied up in their designated area until the Grand Parade
7. BIRDS – Other than class 4 (e.g. budgies, etc.)
8. HORSES & ponies (must be the child's own)
9. OTHER PETS – cats, kittens, guinea pigs, goldfish, etc. (cats only if comfortable in a cage please).
10. Pre-Schooler's Pet (will be entered in relevant class).
11. Owner/Pet Look- A-like Contest – dress up, face paint or create a mask that looks like your pet. Children dress up **not** the animals.
12. Lamb Drinking Race – (please provide a 200ml bottle of milk for this event).

Programme details:

1pm.....Judging begins.

Your child will be asked questions about the pet, similar to the requirements for the projects. Please look at these and discuss them with your child. It is a good way for the children to think about the care of animals. Please stay away when the judge is with your child and let them answer the questions themselves. Pets are not compared. There is no “best” dog or pony, etc.

When judging is finished the “**Lamb Drinking**” race will take place. Please bring a bottle with 200mls of milk. After the signal is given the lamb hears its name being called and runs to drink the milk. [Maybe or maybe not!]

“**The look-a-like contest**” is fun . The children put on their masks, etc. and the judges make their decisions.

Grand Parade.... The animals and their owners will be called in groups to parade around the ring.

Please do not get the pets until they are called for, especially the dogs. They must remain tied up because we don't want any lambs becoming chops. We like to keep things happy.

Finally the certificates will be given out. These have points on them, which go towards badges for our agricultural club. These accumulate over a few years. Badges are given out at the final school assembly of the year.

Sometimes we have an activity for the dogs during the judging.

The projects are on display all afternoon in the hall.

This day is usually a wonderful social time for all. See you there!

Pet Projects: Please hand in to the class teachers by Friday 2nd November.

This does qualify as a Summit Challenge.

WHAT TO DO NOW!

- Decide on the pet that you will enter in the show. Begin your project.
- If you have no pet your project could be on a pet you would like to have or one you have had in the past.

PLAN YOUR WORK (some ideas):

- Introduction and information – breed, name, colour, age, habits, why is it special to you.
- Progress – particularly if your pet is a baby – lamb, chicken, calf. (photos are great for this)
- Home and shelter – photos, drawings, maps are helpful.
- Food.
- Uses – companions or pets, wool for carpets, milk, etc.
- Other care – grooming, prevention of diseases and pests.
- The relationship you have with your pet and what they mean to you.
- Your project may be on paper or a multi-media presentation.
- Neat setting out, drawings or photos all add to the appearance of your project and this will be taken into account by your teacher
- Creativity – try to present your information in a different way than you have previously.
- Pets are special. Make sure that you let us know how special they are by telling stories about the antics they get up to.

This is the rubric that teachers will use to mark your work. It may be helpful to you when you are working on your project.

3. Each item must be no longer than 5 minutes preferably shorter.

5. Pupils may enter in more than one item but no more than two per category.
6. Entries close the week before semifinals.
7. **Year 4-8 entries will close on Fri 23 Nov at 9 a.m. Please note Totara pupils will need to have entered BEFORE they go on camp.**
8. Each section will have up to four finalists.
9. Finals for Year 4-8 will be held during school time on Mon 11 Dec. During the finals, the whole school will be invited to watch, along with any parents etc who want to attend. This will be held in the school hall starting at 1.30 pm.
10. Certificates will be given to all finalists.

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
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
