#### 'And' instead of 'but'

As we move through this term with the Growth Mindset work taking place in the classrooms and as a staff, it seems a great time to challenge our thinking. I was talking recently with a colleague and we were exploring the idea of change. Our conversation then became centred on the way we can rephrase our responses to ideas that are shared with us or the feedback we give - how we can use a growth mindset to challenge the way we respond to others.

In the past I am sure we have been presented with new ideas or feedback that has started with an idea or point and then been followed by a 'but'. It is the word 'but' that does the most harm as it negates an idea or point and takes a bit of the gloss off it. An example might be... *Person X (I would like to run a marathon)* *Person Y (That's a nice idea but you aren't fit enough)*. If this is then rephrased to *Person X (I would like to run a marathon)* followed by this response *Person Y (I think that's a nice idea, and what thought have you given about how you will train and what support you might need)*. The second response allows the first person to feel that there is some merit in their idea, and by using 'and' you are then providing some more ideas to consider. You are valuing their thinking and input.

I am excited about the work we are going to be doing with Growth Mindset. It will challenge my own thinking which is great. If you are interested in Growth Mindset and want to know more please feel free to come and chat. I can recommend the work of Dr Carol Dweck who is world renowned for her work in this area.

Please make sure everything is named.

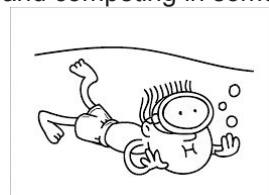

# North Loburn School Flower Show 2018

**Monday 26th February**

**Please read this newsletter section carefully because some entries are created at home and some at school.**

The flower and vegetable displays are made at school with materials from home. Please ask Mrs Green or your class teacher if you are unsure about anything. Cooked articles must be brought to school on Monday morning hygienically packed with cling wrap to protect them from small fingers and flies.

On Monday morning at school the children will prepare their floral entries or vegetable creatures in their classrooms. Equipment and materials must to be brought from home: containers, flowers, vegetables and toothpicks for joining the vegetable creatures. The entries will be made at school during the morning.



No entry forms are needed. Teachers will organise entry forms on the day.

School finishes at 2pm to allow the judges to begin their work in the classrooms judging the exhibits. The first bus will be leaving at this time.

Everyone gets a certificate for their work: either 1st, 2nd, 3rd or 4th.

## Silent Auction:

This has been so successful for the last three years that we have decided to hold it again. Could each family please supply one homemade item of food or produce for the auction. This should be brought to the hall during the day.

Ideas for items: homemade cakes and biscuits, desserts, loaves, sweets, preserves, pickles, jam, homemade bread or buns, homemade lemonade, ginger beer, vegetables or fruit etc. Make sure you get your bids in before 7:00pm when the auction will close. Items will be available to take home when the auction has finished. All money raised will go towards playground equipment.

## Art and Craft Section:

The craft does not have to be created for the show. It can be something the child has made recently.

## Lego:

There are two categories in each classroom: "made with instructions" and "creative" models made without instructions. Please set up the Lego models on a tray or in a suitable container.

## Manuka

\*craftwork created at home e.g. cardboard creation, wool, beads etc.

\*Lego model [created at home] (optional entry)



### Kauri and Kahikatea

\*Art work (created at school)

\*any handicraft or creative contraption e.g. fabric, cross-stitch, woodwork, Christmas decoration, model, etc. created at home or school in the last 12 months.

\*Lego (created at home) (optional)

### Totara

\*Art work (created at school)

\*any handicraft or creative contraption e.g. fabric, cross-stitch, plastic woodwork, model etc. created at home, school or Technology in the last 12 months (optional).

Manuka children may have parental help with their craft because we feel that it is valuable to spend time together on a project such as this. Please understand that judging of this category can be difficult for the judges because of the diversity of the entries.

### Cooking:

We have tried to make this suitable for families with several children. If you have children who need to make a cake and cupcakes, maybe the cake recipe could be doubled and used for both, or all the family can make gingerbread men. There are choices in each category and only one item needs to be made for display.

### Kowhai, Rimu and Manuka

\*a small selection of decorated biscuits (e.g. wine biscuits)

or

\*a decorated Gingerbread man or selected Gingerbread men

### Kahikatea and Kauri

\*a selection of decorated cupcakes/muffins or

\*a decorated Gingerbread man or selected Gingerbread men.

### Totara

\*a creatively decorated cake or

\*a decorated Gingerbread man or selected Gingerbread men.

### Flowers/Vegetables

We have reduced this category to one item per class.

### **Important reminder:**

The children must assemble all the following entries at school on Monday morning. Please bring everything needed to school by 9am. Part of the morning will be set aside to create the floral arrangements and vegetable creatures so please do not make them at home.

Sand for saucers and gardens will be available at school.

Kowhai, Rimu and Manuka: Sand saucer - small flowers please (container provided at school)

Kahikatea: Vegetable creatures: children will need vegetables and toothpicks.

Kauri and Totara: Miniature gardens - trays or meat trays approximately A4 size. Flowers and any other material required to make a creative garden. All soil must be covered.

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
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
