Year 7/8 Technology Programme - what our students think

During the last week I took the opportunity to ask our Year 7 and 8 students about their thoughts on the technology programme they attend at Rangiora Borough. In 2017 we were lucky to have the opportunity for our students to have greater choice of their own learning at technology, with projects of choice being delivered. Our waharoa, our signpost and the banners in the hall were just some of the results from this programme. I was interested in gauging their opinions for the year so far, knowing that at some point they would also be given the chance to choose something they have a passion for this year. I asked them about their greatest successes, their greatest challenge and how they felt our own PRIDE values helped them.

For many, their greatest success was finishing a project. For some, it was learning a brand new skill and for others experiencing a topic they would not normally choose. For their greatest challenge some said staying focused and being patient as some things take time, learning how to use a sewing machine was a popular statement and trying to remember the steps to go through when cooking. When asked about the PRIDE values they talked about how RESPECT was important as they work with different teachers. PERSEVERANCE was also very important to them as it meant they were already skilled in pushing ahead and keeping on going.

I was delighted with the honesty of the comments and the overall positive feeling from what they shared. I hope to repeat this process in late Term 4 to gauge their thoughts once the programme has finished and to see if there are any significant changes.

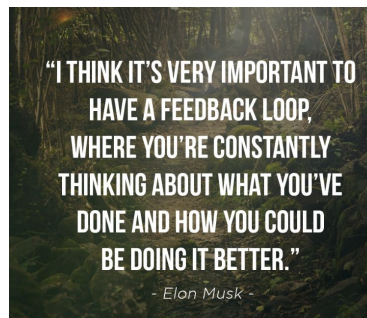

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
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
